## The Spirit of Taisho Romanticism Former Residence of Sasuke Toyoda

The Former Residence of Sasuke Toyoda is composed of an elegant white Western-style building and a tranquil Japanese-style building. The residence passes on the architectural style of the Taisho Period to us today.

His elder brother Sakichi Toyoda is a master inventor and original founder of the world-famous Toyota.

This facility is on loan by the owner to the City of Nagoya free of compensation, and open to the public.
